Types of Prayer:

1) **Prayer of Petition-** This is the most common prayer most Christians use, It must be a prayer of Faith. This is the prayer you would pray for yourself. **(Heb 11:1. Phil 1:25)**

Ex: Lord, I pray you allow me to sleep in peace tonight, In Jesus name.

2) **Intercessory Prayer-** Praying on behalf of someone else. **Rom 8:34 Kj** Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.

3) **Corporate Prayer**—Prayer that is corporately prayed with other believers.

Ex: Acts 4:23-32

Matt 18:18,19 kjv;

Lord, we agree that whatsoever we bind on earth, shall be bound in heaven, and whatsoever we loose on earth shall be loosed in Heaven.

Deut 32:30 kjv

³⁰ How should one chase a thousand, and two put ten thousand to flight, except their Rock had sold them, and the LORD had shut them up?

4) **Warfare Prayer-** Prayer that is used directly in combat against Satan, demon spirits, spiritual wickedness in high places, forces of darkness and witchcraft etc. **Luke 10:19; Is 54:17**

Ex: Lord, I bind the devil and send him to the Abyss in the name of Jesus. He will not steal my joy. He will not destroy my family in Jesus name. I take my healing back in Jesus name. I send the the fire of God, the judgement of God, and the Blood of Jesus against every opposition in my life in Jesus name. 1st Kings 17:17-23

¹⁷ And it came to pass after these things, that the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, fell sick; and his sickness was so sore, that there was no breath left in him.¹⁸ And she said unto Elijah, What have I to do with thee, O thou man of God? art thou come unto me to call my sin to remembrance, and to slay my son?¹⁹ And he said unto her, Give me thy son. And he took him out of her bosom, and carried him up into a loft, where he abode, and laid him upon his own bed.²⁰ And he cried unto the LORD, and said, O LORD my God, hast thou also brought evil upon the widow with whom I sojourn, by slaying her son?
